Pastor's Corner

Dear Church,

The new year is a wonderful reminder that we can leave things in the past and move forward in Christ. Often, we make plans to try to change our life in the new year. We set resolutions and goals. Some stick. Many do not. We focus on changing something. I want to take a moment, not to challenge you to do something, but to reflect on who you already are in Christ. When Jesus begins the sermon on the mount, he describes the identity of the kingdom believer. Mike has covered much of this in his last sermon series. In Matthew 5:13-16 Jesus describes the results of such kingdom residents within our broken world. He describes his followers as light and salt. He wasn't asking them to do something different, but to see themselves in a different light. Because of Christ's work within our hearts, we can mold the culture around us. Just as salt preserves and enhances the flavors of the things it encounters; our lives shape the culture around us. Just as light reveals things and creates a new perspective, our actions and words reveal God's work in our lives and open a new perspective for others to see. Take some time this new year to reflect on the ways that the Holy Spirit has shaped your life and how your ordinary, daily life with Jesus is shaping the culture around you. Kingdom work is often subtle but is always powerful. How do we take what we know of the good news of lesus and use it to help bring change around us? How do we act as the flavoring of a society – people whose reactions to situations change the experience for many? Or as light -offering new perspectives for others? Jesus suggests that we act differently, but that it will begin because our identity is rooted in our relationship with God our Father. What might be possible if that is the case?





We had a regular business meeting on January 10th at 6:30. There was a potluck meal beforehand. Highlights from the meeting:

*We have received a quote from the contractor for our planned addition and parking lot. The contractor feels sure we can meet all of our priorities and still be at or under our budgeted amount with little to no cuts in the project. The priorities are: more parking in front and on the side, bigger and better bathrooms at the front, adding offices to the front of the building so the current offices can be used for classrooms, and a covered area for dropping off in bad weather. This drop off area was originally planned for the front but we are considering moving it to the side.

*There is still a safe deposit box at Prosperity in the Baptist Temple name. The council agreed we should close it out. Church members voted to close it.

*Two prospects came forward for membership! Leah Garrett, Mike and Lydia's daughter, has recently moved from Waco. Brian Munday also came seeking membership. Even though Brian lives in London, he spends a lot of time here in Victoria during the year. The council felt he has demonstrated he can remain active while he is here in the states and online when he's in London. Both were accepted on statement of faith unanimously. We will celebrate with them at the next Agape celebration on February 18th.

Year-end financials were presented at the business meeting as well the financial reports for November and December. We predicted our contributions would be \$90,000 for 2023, and we actually collected over \$103,000. We budgeted \$113,857 for expenses, and our spending for 2023 totaled \$111,247. So we were under-budget on spending and collected over what we predicted. Our budget for 2024 is set at \$119,562. We also have \$513,966 in our investment fund. This will be used for our building project.
