

### **Pastor's Corner**

The armor of God

Many of you are familiar with Ephesians 6:10-17 where Paul talks about the armor of God. I felt that this would be a good reminder for us in this season of our church life. It is a reminder that we have a battle to fight. However, Paul makes it very clear that we do not fight against humans. The world around us is not the enemy. We battle against the spiritual forces of the heavenly realm. So, how do we battle against things that we cannot see and often do not understand? We must rely on the things that he has given us. We must turn to the truth that God has revealed to us. We must hold on to it like a belt that holds us together. We are to keep righteousness close to our heart as a breastplate. This doesn't mean that we pick ourselves up by the bootstraps and make ourselves better, but that we recognize God's work in our hearts that brings us into a right relationship and we live within that truth.

Then we have the stability and readiness that comes from the gospel of peace. This is the good news of Jesus that brings peace to all of humanity. The life, death, and resurrection of Jesus brings peace with God and love and kindness to our fellow neighbors.

Not only do we have the armor that protects us, but we have the shield of faith which will extinguish the flaming arrows of the enemy. It not only protects us, but actively takes away Satan's power as he attacks us.

Salvation is the ultimate protection for us in this battle, guarding us where we are most vulnerable just as a helmet. We can hold to the truth of God's salvation with confidence because it is rooted in his power and work that has already been done in the cross.





### **CHURCH NEWS**

We had a quarterly regular business meeting on Wednesday, October 9. Pastor Jeremy will be out of the office November 11-12 for the Texas Baptist Conference in Waco. We donated around 40 shoes to Shoes for Orphan Souls. Collectively between us and several other churches, we shipped 500 pairs. We reached our Mary Hill Davis goal by collecting \$811 for Texas missions. We now have 95 members. For the quarter, we gained 12 members and lost 1. Financially, we've gained around \$30,000 from our investment fund. Judy James reported that while we have spent a little over \$100 so far in fees to Vanco for online giving, we have brought in over \$10,000 so far this year with the program. When giving, people are given the opportunity to pay for the fees. Most are doing that, which helps us out. We will be collecting items for college finals survival bags throughout the month of November. We will pack the bags on Monday, December 2nd. They will be passed out to students when we have lunch for them at the GBA on December 3rd. Our next celebration will be combined with our Thanksgiving lunch on Saturday, November 16.

We have an update on our building project. The city has said we need to either expand the east driveway or make it a one-way. Expanding it would add to our expense, but it was decided we needed to do. It would also make the drive to the side parking lot a straight shot, whereas before it had a curve. We are expecting the city to approve this change. When that happens, we can look at our quotes. We have one and are waiting on another. Once we have both, we can schedule a meeting to vote on them. Construction of the side parking lot could begin soon!

all kinds of trials, big and small, that will result in a measure of grief. And yet the disposition he wants for his readers is not one of Christians, and what has come to us as a result of that mercy. And then he leads into the reality of life, that we will all experience Before getting to the subject of trials, Peter writes in beautiful detail about the great mercy of God that has been given to us as

It seems, in fact, that Peter is viewing these trials as an opportunity. That's the disposition we are after. But an opportunity for what? At least three things:

1. Trials are an opportunity for faith refinement.

Trials give us the chance to display what we truly believe. We might say we believe that God is good; that He is powerful; that He is wise in all things, but trials show the genuineness of those statements. How we react during moments of trouble isn't just a reflection of our faith. reflection of whether we are having a good day or not; it's a

2. Trials are an opportunity for joy clarification.

things. And yet they cannot be the ultimate source of our joy. It must go deeper than that, and because of God's mercy, He has given us the true reservoir or joy. It is in Him. Trials, because of their very nature, threaten our temporal sources of joy, and We tend to find joy in all different kinds of things, and many of those things are good. Family, friends, food - these are all good therefore give us an opportunity to clarify to ourselves where our ultimate joy lies.

3. Trials are an opportunity for hope sharpening.

stronger; we hope that we will have enough money saved for retirement. And yet all of those things that we hope for simply might Similarly, we hope for many things. We hope for a job change or for an end to illness; we hope for relationships to get better or not happen. That's one of the reasons why trials bring grief – it's because they threaten our hope, just as they threaten our joy. But what an opportunity for the Christian to remember that we have a better hope – a living hope – that grows in our hearts and minds day by day as all living things do.

Chances are there will be some trial that enters your life today. The question, then, is less about whether it will happen, but how we will view it. Will it be a threat, or an opportunity?
